The following courses will transfer into Detroit Mercy’s Economics and Financial Economics programs. Students may transfer a maximum of 63 credits toward a Bachelor’s Degree; course grades must be a C or better. If admitted under the MCC-Detroit Mercy Financial Economics Articulation Agreement, Financial Economics students may transfer a total of 96 credits. Additional courses not on this guide may also transfer.
